

Make Me As Clay

In watching a documentary about porcelain works, one can apparently learn much about life. The process begins with a hard substance that must be ground up to form the clay. Factors to do with nature and the components added to the clay determine the various degrees of quality clay. From this the artist manipulates the clay to form fantastic shapes. Many times as the art is forming it is difficult to determine what it is being created until the very culmination of the shaping process. Ultimately this mass of dirt is formed into a beautiful creation. When this is complete it is fired in a furnace, beautifully painted then fired again. It may go through several firings before it is complete. What is seemingly the most skillful and impressive of all is the painting of the sculptures. Impressive because the colors brushed on to the pieces prior to firing are not the same as the colors seen after they are fired into the art. The artist has to know before hand exactly what will happen. He must have the finished image in his mind while he is painting a picture that looks completely different. This color alteration makes it very different than painting on a canvas. In fact, the colors vary significantly based on the nature of the particular clay being used. In the furnace the clay absorbs the colors and makes them part of itself. Each clay has its own nuances of effect on the paint that is applied by the artist.



The making of man is very much like this. God is the potter, and we are the clay (Isaiah 64:8). God's work or molding is done from within instead of without. As we develop at His hand we start in a very crude form but we, determined to be the proper clay, by His design emerge finally as the beautiful piece he would have us to be (Ephesians 4:11-16). We then as humans have desires, and feelings, and emotions, and passions that are our nature, our components, and we will allow these to either guide us to heaven or drive us to hell. None of these natures are innately evil. They are the components of the clay that when touched by God's paint and fired into the soul, combine. How these react with the soul and the soul with them determine the final picture that will be produced. Only God can see the potential of the finished picture, the beautiful vessel when all the firing is complete.

On occasion at the porcelain shop the final piece would emerge from the kiln fatally flawed. In these cases the clay was contaminated or faulty in some way and received the paint unevenly or incorrectly. The paint, God's word, is not the factor. The creator is not to be blamed. The fault is found in the clay. Our Lord has promised to paint a work of art on each of His creations (John 17:17). If we can align our will with His and receive the grace that He has so artfully laid on us we will proudly yield as a slave to Him instead of sin (Romans 6:6-12). How we, the clay, the substrate, receive and absorb the paint through the fires of trial and life will determine if God's vision for each of us will be realized (II Peter 3:9). May we continually be sure our soul is perfectly prepared to receive the word of God and His will for us (Philippians 4:8-9; John 16:24). The picture is beautiful!!! 
